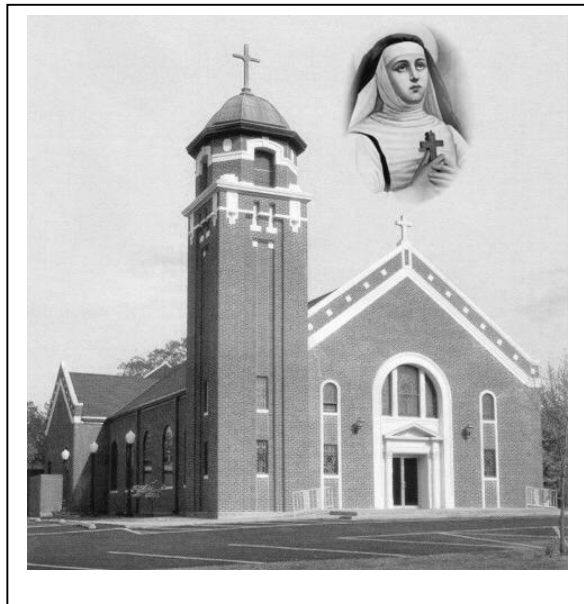

The Feast of Christ the King is on Sunday, November 22nd.

A Plenary Indulgence can be obtained by reciting the Prayer “Act of Dedication of the Human Race to Jesus Christ King” publicly on the feast of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, along with meeting the requirements as explained.

A Plenary Indulgence is the remission of temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, and can be applied to yourself or to the souls of the deceased.

Here's what you need to do for an INDULGENCE:

First, you can get only ONE Plenary Indulgence per day.

Second, you must be in the state of grace (not have any un-confessed mortal sins on your soul) and these three conditions must accompany the act needed to gain the indulgence:

1. You must receive the sacrament of confession, either eight days before or after the indulgence is to be gained,
2. You must receive Holy Communion on that day (see: that's a good reason to go to Mass frequently!)
3. You must recite prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary is the minimum, but any other additional prayers may be added).

Finally—and this is a tough one, sometimes: you must not have any attachment to sin, even venial sin.
